Home Start is a charity that offers support to local vulnerable families (with at least one child under 5 years of age), in the Stroud District and Quedgeley. This year they will start to offer support in Gloucester.

Support and friendship for families

They offer one to one support to families in the family home through a dedicated team of volunteers. These volunteers attend a 10 week training course, with the

next courses starting in Brockworth (21st January) and Stonehouse (22nd January). Volunteers visit the family home once a week for 2-3 hours, to help and support families.

They also offer families Groups, Bump Start, an antenatal group for expecting parents. The Best Start Group, a post-natal groups for parents looking at weaning, safe sleep, baby massage, first aid etc. and the Mothers in Mind Group for Mums with low - moderate mental health, this group is open to mums and their children and is a drop in being run at the Beacon Centre.
