Teams 4 U Shoebox Appeal

Shoe boxes are a lovely way of giving a gift to someone who might not otherwise receive anything at Christmas. Teams 4 U run a nationwide shoebox appeal each year to provide Christmas gifts to vulnerable children and families. This year the shoeboxes will be heading to the Ukraine, Moldova, Georgia, Bosnia and Romania.

We had decided as a school that we wouldn't participate in the shoebox scheme this year. Given the current economic situation, we wanted to limit the amount of demands we were placing on our families, however a few parents have asked if we can arrange a collection. Jenny Frost has worked with the shoebox appeal for a number of years and has kindly said that if anyone wants to make or has already made a Shoebox or would like to donate any items she'd be happy to come and collect it from school, ideally on or before Thursday 8th December at the latest.

Our Play Makers have been receiving specific training in how to manage and support low-level conflicts with younger children. Times Table Rockstars

At Beech Green, we believe that a secure knowledge of times table facts helps children to be more successful and confident in maths. For example, if your child knows their 5x table, they will find it easier when learning to tell the time (5 past, 10 past, etc). Further up the school, times table knowledge is essential when completing challenging arithmetic calculations or working with fractions, factors and square numbers.

With this in mind, please make use of the fantastic Times Table Rockstars app which the school subscribes too. There are a number of different games and challenges which are fun and engaging. If your child has forgotten their user name or password, please let their class teacher know.

Perhaps you could challenge yourself to be the top TTRS player at Beech Green? Currently, this is held by a pupil in Sycamore 6, with an impressive speed of 0.72 seconds per answer! Sycamore are also the class with the most active players in the last two weeks, followed by Hornbeam then Acacia.

Netball News


