Message from Mrs Pope

Dear parents and carers,

This has been another busy two weeks at Beech Green. I have really enjoyed meeting more of you on the gate, do continue to introduce yourself.

I had the privilege of accompanying the School Council to the remembrance service at St James' Church, on 11th November. The children were an absolute credit to you and to the school. A member of the public commented on how super they were! We raised a total of £257.29 for Children in Need - thank you for the donations.

In assembly this week, we introduced some new initiatives in school to encourage and reward our children:

House Points

By working hard, doing excellent work or showing great behaviours for example, children will get house points if they're in Year 1-6. These will be via DOJO but all these points now go towards their houses. The points will be cumulative and the winning house will be announced each week in assembly. There will be a star placed on the house point board to show the house that won. This board is near the office. The house with the most stars at the end of term will get a non uniform day. EYFS staff have decided that they will continue with their own reward system as the children are new into school, but will still be able to participate in the non uniform day according to their house.

Class Rewards

All classes will work towards a class reward decided as a class, eg PJ day, a film and pop corn etc. Classes need to earn 50 marbles by working together on great behaviour and attitudes to achieve this. This will encourage class mates to work together!

Recognition Boards

Classes will have a board in classrooms that recognises members of their class for achievements in and out of school and great behaviours.





Portrait Photos

The Day the Crayons Quit

By Drew Daywalt

Duncan just wants to do some colouring - but when he opens his box of crayons, he finds a whole bundle of letters of complaint. His crayons have long been mistreated and they are fed up. Beige is sick and tired of playing second fiddle to Brown; Blue is exhausted after colouring in so many oceans, lakes and rivers; Orange and Yellow can't agree on who is really the colour of the sun; and Peach has a rather embarrassing problem.

The crayons aren't happy! Can Duncan come up with a solution to keep the crayons happy - before they quit colouring for good?

This hilarious book is a real work of art: each beautifully-designed spread features an entertaining handwritten letter from one of the crayon. The amount of text may make this a little challenging for younger readers to tackle alone, but this is a perfect book to share, with enough wit and lively imagination to entertain parents just as much as children. A powerful tribute to creativity, this book will leave children looking at their box of crayons in a completely different way.

Featuring a hospital heist, a mattress salesman, hairdressing accessories from a skip, a unicorn singing show tunes, and lots of cows, this witty comedy thriller showcases the resourcefulness and courage of a trio of youngsters known as the Dream Bandits.
